










## **Facility Use**

Haller Middle School opened in September 2006. The school was constructed on the site where Arlington High School was located from the 1930s to 2002. In order to build Haller, many of the former high school buildings were demolished. Exceptions to this were the gym and music buildings that were remodeled and incorporated into the new school. The new portion of the school was connected to the remodeled gym and includes a commons, administrative offices and a two-story classroom wing. Haller's campus includes a courtyard area, baseball/softball fields, soccer/football field with grandstands, lights and a track. You are invited to become an active part of our school.

## **School Improvement Plan**

Haller Middle School has made great progress in their 2023-24 goals of training staff using Universal Design for Learning (UDL) modules. At this point in the year, the staff have completed training in five modules. Sixty-eight percent of Haller's staff have started implementation of UDL strategies or have tried, 20% of Haller staff are using UDL strategies daily, while 12% indicated they need more help or professional development in PD. We will continue professional development on our early release Fridays using the UDL modules.

We are continually working throughout this year on our second goal of actively fostering a safe, caring, and positive environment that enhances student achievement and well being through Character Strong implementation and reinforcing our S.O.A.R. expectations. In doing so, we are recognizing students that represent S.O.A.R. (Striving for Excellence, Organized and Prepared, Accepting of Self and Others, and Responsible and Respectful) values through our Student of the Month recognition, our Hawk cards, and our RAH (Recognition at Haller) breakfasts.
